What does the Clinic Offer?

- Interventions such as therapeutic exercise, functional training, manual therapy techniques, and electrotherapeutic and physical agent modalities to improve the health and function of each patient.
- Provides therapy in the areas of range of motion, manual muscle testing, as well as for deficits in sensation, perception, and cognition.
- Completes an evaluation and establishes a plan of care including specific interventions designed to produce changes in the patient's condition in order to achieve the desired outcomes.
- Teaches patients how to become more independent in dressing, bathing, shaving, cooking, etc.
- Designs take-home instructions for patient to complete a home exercise program.
- Treatments for children ranging from subtle developmental challenges that may not be problematic enough for medical intervention, to those with severe medical challenges or developmental delays.
- Provides exploration of the clinic's universal design kitchen, adaptive equipment, and ideas for a home remodel.

Who Provides the Therapy?

As a student-run clinic, treatment is provided as a collaboration between SLCC students and therapists who are SLCC faculty. The average ratio for a patient at the clinic is two students to one faculty member per session.

Physical & Occupational Therapy

Physical and occupational therapists provide health care services to patients of all ages and health conditions.

Physical and occupational therapists serve the community by improving and maintaining the quality of life of individuals.

Medical Assistants

SLCC Medical Assistant students provide front office assistance, Electronic Medical Records (EMR), and coordination of care at the Clinic.

Radiologic Technology

Radiologic technologists perform X-ray examinations and are responsible for accurately positioning patients and ensuring that a quality diagnostic image is produced.

What about Costs and Services?

All services are provided **free of charge**.

Services are provided to individuals:

- Who do not have insurance benefits for physical therapy and occupational therapy.
- Referred by their PT or OT who need more service than what their current benefits will provide.
- Who have exhausted their benefits for PT or OT and continue to need service.
