

## SLCC Program Equivalency Agreement | SAT Competency-Based to Credit

Salt Lake Community College | Culinary Arts

Prior to granting undergraduate credit for learning outcomes achieved & completed in a competency-based program of study, students must:

- Successfully complete the competency-based School of Applied Technologies Commercial Foods Certificate (KCUL) as indicated -- individual courses will not be considered.
- Complete the *SLCC Non-Credit to Credit Equivalent* application for admission through the Admissions Office.
  - ✓ Indicate the aligned program of study (No fee is charged to student.)
- Complete SLCC admission requirements.

This agreement is effective Fall Semester 2018 and will remain in effect until curricular changes are made to either program.
